POSITION DESCRIPTION

Leader of Curriculum

- Co-design and implement a rigorous, applied Project Based Learning curriculum aligned with the mission to prepare students for college, apprenticeships, or entry into the healthcare workforce.
- Embrace innovative teaching practices and mastery-based assessment models to foster skill development and deeper learning, culminating in student-led exhibitions with community partners.
- Collaborate with co-teachers to deliver interdisciplinary, inclusive instruction that integrates real-world health sector challenges and solutions.
- Incorporate cultural and linguistic responsiveness in all teaching practices to reflect and respect the diversity of the school community.

Leader in Community Engagement
