### Least Restrictive Environment

Health Leadership High School is a fully inclusive school that provides special education supports within the context of the general education classroom. Only when the general education classroom does not become the least restrictive environment, will the student be removed from the classroom and their typically developing peers. In addition, HLHS promotes a cooperative/collaborative teaching model that allows for additional support within each classroom and assistance from special education teachers.

### PBL Instruction within a Three Pillar Model

- The majority of HLHS courses are delivered through PBL
  - Rigorous projects grounded in authentic work with community partners in the health industry
  - These projects culminate in public exhibitions
- Core Math Instruction is delivered through Academic PBL
  - Greater emphasis on the math content than the health industry

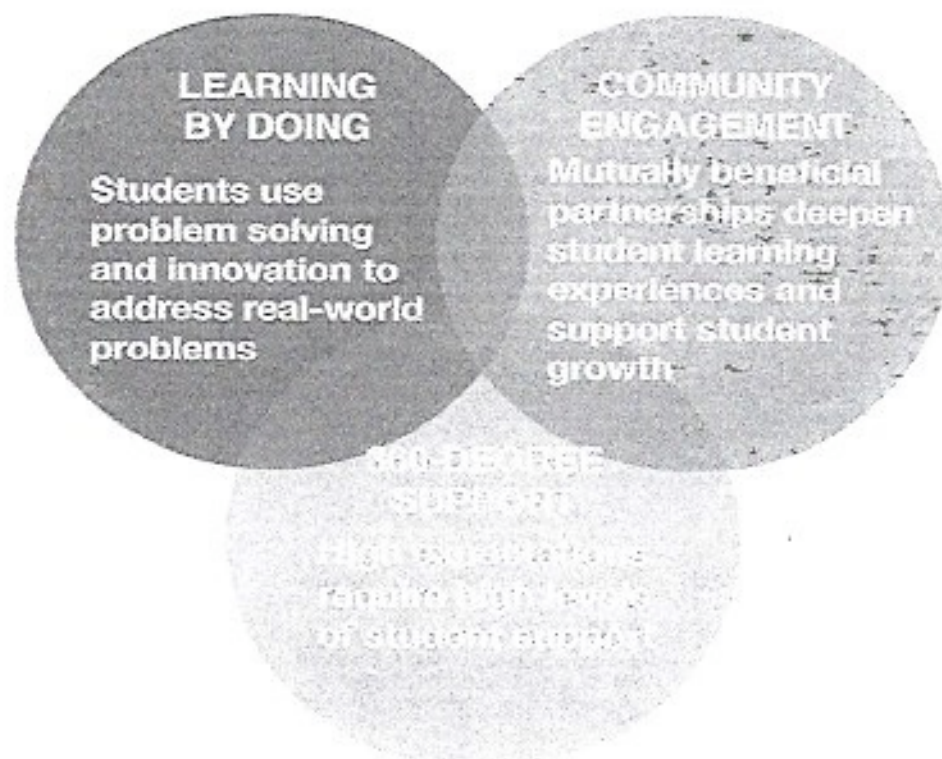
#### Project-based Learning is Rigorous

  - Construction of Knowledge (evaluate, synthesize, make predictions, propose solutions)
